The Foundation issued its first report examining what life is like for people in Central Texas and highlights the apparent opportunity gap across a wide spectrum of daily life, including educational attainment, access to living wage jobs, the affordability of safe and central housing, and health outcomes.

The Women's Fund at Austin Community Foundation issued a report in 2017 that looks at the reality for women and children in the Austin area. The report focuses on six indicator areas and illustrates that there is still much work to be done to ensure the economic security of women in our community.

Hispanic Impact Fund

In May, local Hispanic leaders and Austin Community Foundation raised \$500,000 – including a \$250,000 grant from Google.org – to launch the Hispanic Impact Fund, a new giving network focused on supporting the economic security and advancement of Hispanic Central Texans.

Central Texas Long-Term Hurricane Recovery Fund

In response to the devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey, Austin Community Foundation, Capital Factory, Entrepreneurs Foundation of Central Texas, LiveOak Ventures, MFI Foundation, and United Way for Greater Austin teamed up to support affected communities on the long journey ahead. All donations to the fund will be deployed over the next several years through strategic grants supporting long-term recovery efforts.

Impact Investing

With pooled resources, the Foundation invested \$1 million in 2017 toward the economic security of Austinites through Impact Investing. The Impact Investment Fund offers a sophisticated, local investment strategy with exceptional local social returns. Last year, the fund invested in College Forward, Grameen America, People Fund and BCL of Texas.

The Foundation celebrated 40 years in Austin with a birthday party at the Long Center in October. More than 200 people—longstanding supporters and a new generation of givers—came together to relish this milestone and look ahead to another 40 years of creating the Austin where we all want to live.

Keyholder17

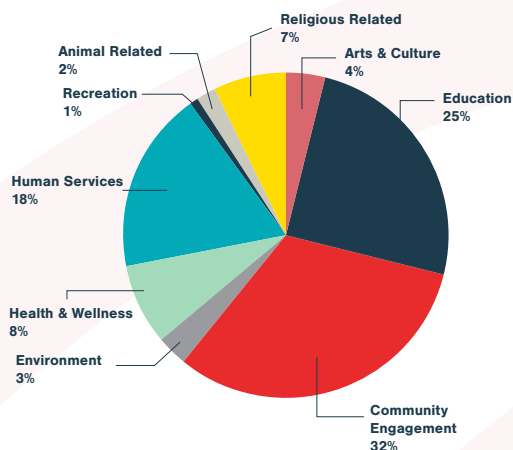

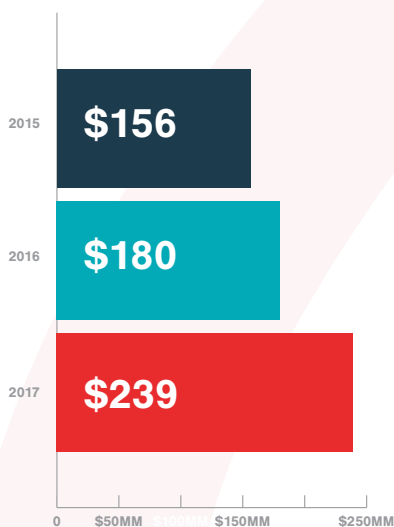

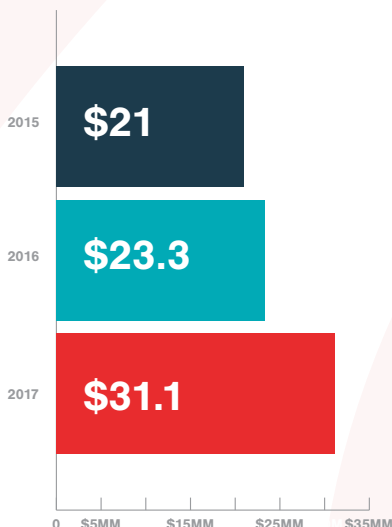
2017 GRANTMAKING BY PROGRAM AREA TOTAL: \$31.1MM



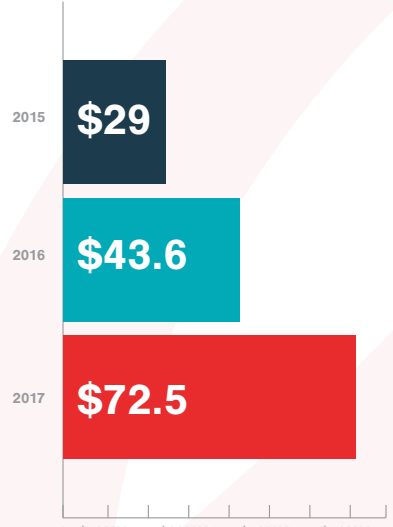
ASSETS
